We are very proud to share a recent data release from the Department for Education regarding outcomes at Ashdene in 2024.

As you will see Ashdene continue to perform exceptionally well in all areas.

Being in the 99th percentile for outcomes in reading, writing and maths at the end of key stage two means that Ashdene performed higher than 99% of all schools nationally.

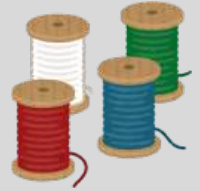


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Sewing Club
